

BACKGROUND

This ToT initiative represents the development and training of "Trainers of Trainers" which in turn will develop First Aid Trainers, and ultimately, the learners who will carry forward first aid knowledge and skills within their community.

Based on the GFARC, IFRC and ICRC initiative in the Russian speaking national societies, the training was planned to take place in Ukraine end of 2018 but it was postponed for security reasons.

This year the course took place in Bulgaria and included the following 11 national societies: Armenia Red Cross, Belarus Red Cross, Georgia Red Cross, Kazakhstan Red Crescent, Kyrgyzstan Red Crescent, Russian Red Cross, Tajikistan Red Crescent, Turkmenistan Red Crescent, Ukraine Red Cross Uzbekistan Red Crescent, Bulgarian Red Cross.



POINTS OF STRENGHT


- Extensive experience of some candidates as TOT's made the teaching sessions more valuable
- Some adjusted methodologies from the Master Educator candidates increased the learning experience



- The participatory approach allowed participants to share their experiences and build on each other's experiences
- The whole curriculum was covered in the designated timing despite the translation delays
- The level of acceptance from the participants was high
- Instructional activities that were used were interesting for participants and motivated them
- The participants had the chance to visit the Bulgarian Red Cross with the objective of having learnt the experience of the sustainable FA system and key role of the national society throughout the country. The participants have increased their knowledge in FA response, commercialization and education.

- The support of the Bulgarian Red Cross facilitated the logistics aspect of the course
- The coordination and the pre-knowledge of the status of the participants by the Regional ICRC FA delegate made the ToT a success and met the needs of the participants

CHALLENGES/ RISKS

Challenge/Risk	What was done	Results
Translation from Russian to English in plenary delayed the timing of closure of the training days	Two English speaking participants from Bulgarian Red Cross, 2 facilitators, 2 translators were present, whenever possible the translation was taking place in 2 small groups	The flow of the sessions were easier when the main trainer was talking directly in Russian and the time management was better
Some participants had a very big experience and wanted to share all their experience during several sessions which was extending the session timing and closure timing of the sessions	Participants were reminded of the group norms and respecting everybody's timing	Participants were able to make precise and short interventions during the activities while keeping the experience sharing and learning from each other which was a positive aspect
Discrepancy regarding the knowledge and experience among the participants	Participants with lower level benefited from peer evaluation during the microteaching sessions	Participants had a good understanding of what to improve in their knowledge and skills

LESSONS LEARNED

- 1. For upcoming ToT's in the region, make sure that all participants have one common language to facilitate the teaching experience
- 2. Consider an extra day for curriculum where translation is required for the course, in addition to adjusting the topics per day
- 3. Joining the course site before 2 days was very beneficial as the facilitation team had time to go over the course and prepare together
- 4. Change the candidate selection process from national societies of central Asia by inviting potential candidates by name


WAY FORWARD

This training shed light on things to improve in specific national societies:

- Consider reinforcement of the FA training component within the national societies of Turkmenistan and Tajikistan due to the recent decrease of staff engaged in FA activities. The current staff are not properly trained in FA








ANNEX 1 – PARTICIPANTS PRE/POST TEST RESULTS
