Hello GFARC Volunteers!

Thank you for participating in the *2020 International First Aid, Resuscitation, and Education Guidelines* orientation workshop. This workshop intended to introduce you to some of the highlights in the 2020 Guidelines. The workshop provided an opportunity to discuss new themes with peers and to begin reflecting on how this critical tool will be used within your role as a GFARC contributor.

**Note:** Please be mindful to write your learning plan activities as specific steps that are realistic, measurable and attainable.



Question 1: As a GFARC contributor, how do I envision the 2020 Guidelines will be used in my professional practice moving forward?

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Question 2: What responsibilities do I have to ensure that I am familiar with the content and can apply it within my role and when working with peers?

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Question 3: What actions will I take to become knowledgeable of the 2020 Guidelines? How will I know that I have been successful in my learning?

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Question 4: What timelines should I be mindful of when creating my action plan? (example: are there upcoming assignments I need to be prepared for?).

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Question 5: Based on my unique professional experience and knowledge, are there specific areas of understanding within the 2020 Guidelines that I anticipate needing to spend extra time learning about?

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Question 6: Do I anticipate any challenges that I will need to overcome (either individually or with my team's support) to be successful with this task?
