The overall survival rate after out-of-hospital cardiac arrest is approximately 10%.



Approximately 40% of people who suffer out-of-hospital cardiac arrest receive CPR before emergency services arrive.

Early defibrillation, performed within the first few minutes, can increase the survival rate to 80%.

FIRST AID

73.4% of out-of-hospital cardiac arrests occur at home, 16.3% in public places, and 10.3% in nursing homes.

In 2024, 1,471,432 people were trained in CPR by the RCRC Movement during World Days.

Rapid CPR maintains blood flow to the brain, reducing the risk of irreversible brain damage.

The proportion of the population trained in CPR varies from 3% to 79% depending on the country, with a global median of 40%.

The rate of CPR administered by bystanders varies from 1.3% to 72% depending on the country.
